

# SuperDuo and MiniDuo Twin Cube Wave Band

**ADDENDUM**

**UPDATE:** Since I created this design in 2012, a number of new two-hole beads have appeared on the bead scene. SuperDuo and MiniDuo beads work especially well as a substitute for Twin beads in this design!

## MATERIALS

### SuperDuo bead version

(for a 8.25 inch bracelet, not including clasp)

- 7 yards of 6 lb. FireLine
- About 240 size 11/0 seed beads
- About 60 size 8/0 seed beads
- About 180 Color1 SuperDuo beads
- About 100 Color2 SuperDuo beads
- About 100 size 3mm cube beads
- regular single strand clasp or a 21mm 3-strand slide clasp

### MiniDuo bead version

(for a 7.5 inch bracelet, not including clasp)

- 7 yards of 6 lb. FireLine
- About 300 size 11/0 seed beads
- About 180 Color1 MiniDuo beads
- About 100 Color2 MiniDuo beads
- About 100 size 3mm cube beads
- regular single strand clasp or a 21mm 3-strand slide clasp

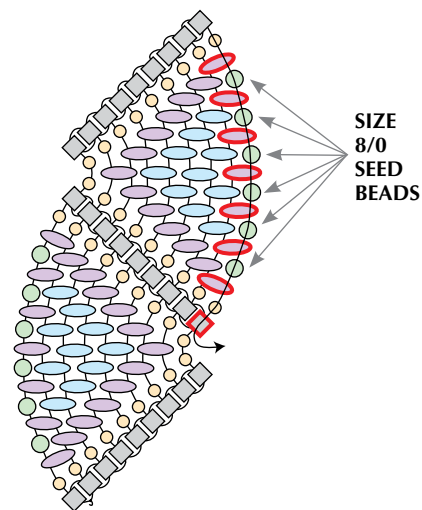
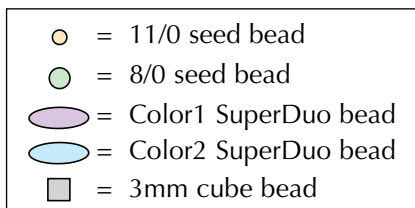


SUPERDUO BEAD VERSION

**STEP 74:** Add size 8/0 seed beads in between the Color1 SuperDuo beads highlighted in **RED**:



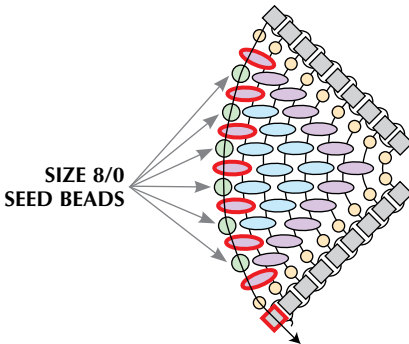

## SUPERDUO BEAD VERSION

Repeat all of the steps for the Twin bead version but make the following substitutions:

- Instead of Twin beads, use SuperDuo beads.
- In Step 42 and 74, you are going to need to use some size 8/0 seed beads along the edge instead of size 11/0 seed beads to fill in the wide gaps created from the tapered ends of the SuperDuo beads.

**STEP 42:** Add size 8/0 seed beads in between the Color1 SuperDuo beads highlighted in **RED**:

## MINIDUO BEAD VERSION

Repeat all of the steps for the Twin bead version but make the following substitution:

- Instead of Twin beads, use MiniDuo beads.
